### Eligibility Criteria

**Age:** 18 years and over

This study is NOT accepting healthy

**Healthy Volunteers:** volunteers

#### Inclusion Criteria:

- 18 to 75 years old - incomplete or complete SCI/D of more than 3months - medically stable.

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#### Exclusion Criteria:

- MRI contra-indications (stabilizing hardware is typically MRI safe) - uncontrolled seizure disorder - cognitive impairment and/or communicative disability (e.g., due to brain injury) that prevents following directions or learning - ventilator dependent - other major medical complications - pregnant women
